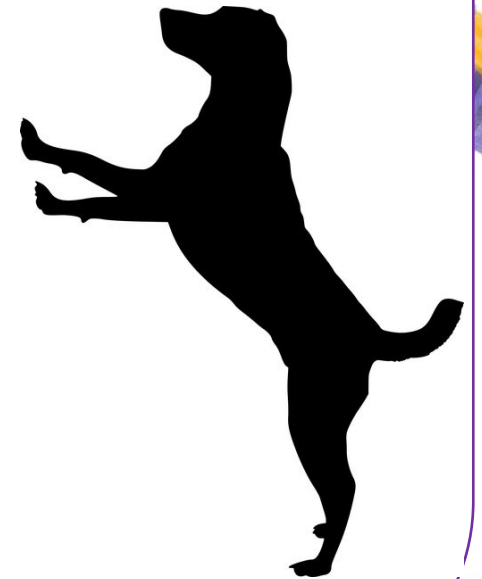

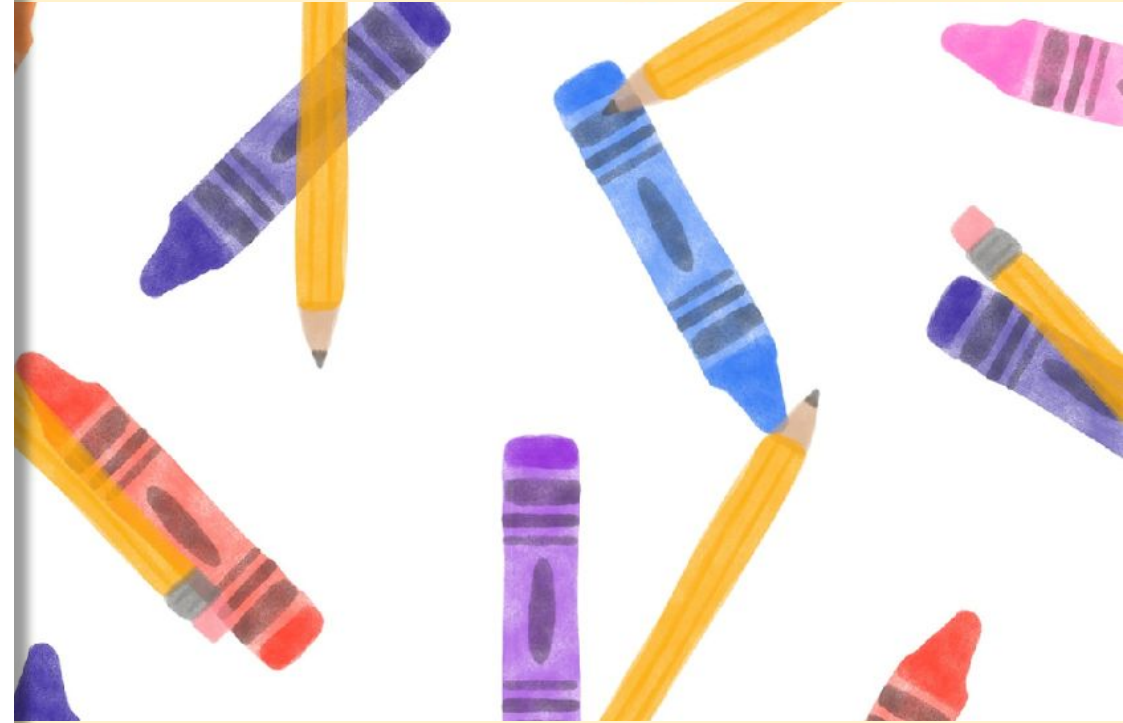

## Grammar Placement Test Scoring Guide

To choose where a student starts, follow the scoring guide below—or your best judgment if it differs!

Start here if...		
Start at Level 1 if...	Student got no sentence from 1A completely correct.	Level 1A. Why is the man sad? Level 1A. I can get it.!
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Start here instead if student got one of the two correct from 1A but missed capitalizing I.</li></ul>	Level 1B. My friend and I sat down. Level 1B. How can I help?
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Start here instead if student got one correct from A and B, but missed all of the proper nouns.</li></ul>	Level 1C. The new Bat Man is awesome.! Level 1C. My mom and I saw Cinderella.
Start at Level 2 if...	Student had at least one sentence correct from 1C, but none from here.	Level 2A. Pandas are black and white. I have a toy panda. Level 2A. Ants live everywhere. I have ants in my home.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Start here instead if student had one correct from 2A, but missed proper nouns (earlier or here).</li></ul>	Level 2B. I like Kermit the frog. He isn't real though. Level 2B. They sell pet frogs at Petco. I like looking at them.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Start here instead if student had one correct from 2A and B, but missed all the contractions.</li></ul>	Level 2C. I can't believe I won!. This is amazing. Level 2C. There's nothing here. Where did you say it was?
Start at Level 3 if...	Student had at least one sentence correct from 2B OR 2C, but did not correctly identify the complete sentences here.	Level 3A. There are 24 types of rattlesnakes. All rattlesnakes have a rattle. The rattle makes a scary noise.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Start here instead if the student was mostly correct on 3A, but missed contractions here or in 2C.</li></ul>	Level 3B. We're going out to dinner tonight. It's my uncle's birthday. He's turning 40.
