How to make a boring sentence awesome....

Boring sentence: The girl went to the thing.



Be specific.

Where?

The girl went to the birthday party at her cousin's house; The girl went to Wal-Mart.

When?

The girl went to the birthday party *right before the clock* struck midnight.; The girl went to Wal-Mart as it was closing. Why?

The girl went to the birthday party because it was her family and her mom said she HAD to go; The girl went to Wal-Mart to get wrapping paper for her mom's birthday gift.



Add adjectives.

Describe the subject!

The *mean* girl went to the birthday party because her mom made her; The *awesome* daughter went to Wal-Mart to grab wrapping paper for her mom's special gift.

Describe the object and anything else in the sentence!

The mean girl went to the *awful*, *boring* birthday party because her mom made her; The awesome daughter went to the *overcrowded* Wal-Mart to grab wrapping paper for her mom's birthday gift.



Use strong verbs.

Went/said/liked are SO boring!!!

The girl walked to the birthday party at her cousin's house. The girl raced to Wal-Mart to get wrapping paper for her mom's present.

Strong verbs for went:

walked, ran, raced, drove, crawled, biked, skateboarded, flew, visited, swam....

Strong verbs for said:

Shouted, yelled, called, whispered, moaned, whined, commanded, demanded, sung, asked, wondered....


Strong verbs for liked...

Adored, loved, worshipped, needed, tolerated, coped with...
